Notes from Fourth Grade Music

What We're Learning

Our first unit in music class as 4th graders involves learning about basic rhythmic patterns in 2/4 time. Through songs and games, we will spend the first couple weeks of school getting the rhythms "in our ear." Soon, we will be able to identify rhythms we hear, and then we will be able to learn to read and write those rhythms.

Grading: Each activity is graded on a 10-point scale. The final grade in music class is given on an "alphabet scale," figured on the average of the grades. All grades are posted immediately to Infinite Campus and quarterly assessment reports will be sent home detailing our work. 10 points (A) means that a student can perform a task successfully on the first attempt.

9 points (A-) means that a student can perform a task successfully with only a little help from the teacher.

8 points (B-) means that a student was able to perform a task successfully with more than a little help from the teacher.

7 points (C-) means that a student was unable to successfully perform a task, even with help.

Written assignments are assigned 10 points using a similar scale.
