What We Do!

During the month of November, we will be working on learning the elements of our "Demonstration Concert." The demonstration concert won't be much different from what we normally do in class. Last month, I talked about "Pitch Exploration." Another element of our musical workout is **Echo Singing.**

Echo Singing involves songs where the teacher sings a phrase and a students sing back. This leads to students being confident singing without an adult leading. Their ears are forced to listen to each other to try to mimic the sounds of the adult singer. This is very similar to how the students learned to speak. By using "baby talk," young babies learn to mimic sounds made by adults. Using echo singing results in better singers because students will listen for the correct musical pitches. Students will also, unknowingly, copy the style of singing used with each song – so we get to explore lots of different sounds in fun and safe ways!
