

Notes from Third Grade Music

What We're Learning

Our first unit in music class as third graders involves learning about tones: mi, re, do, and sol. Through simple songs and games, we will spend the first couple weeks of school getting the sounds "in our ear." Soon, we will be able to identify tonal patterns we hear, and then we will be able to learn to read and write those tonal patterns.

Grading: Each activity is graded on a 4-point scale. The final grade in music class is given in a +/- basis, figured on the average of the grades. All grades are posted immediately to Infinite Campus and quarterly assessment reports will be sent home detailing our work. 4 points (+) means that a student can perform a task successfully on the first attempt. 3 points (+) means that a student can perform a task successfully with the help of the teacher.

2 points (-) means that a student was unable to successfully perform the task, even with help from the teacher.
